DEER HUNT OF YESTERYEAR — That must have been some deerhunt 29 years ago. This picture was originally published in *The Neshoba Democrat* on Jan. 3, 1952 after what was termed a “successful hunt.” A copy of the picture was brought to the *Democrat* office by Mrs. Lois Nowell, wife of one of the proud hunters. The caption under the picture when originally published said: “A real hunter’s paradise was the site where these deer were bagged by the 14 men above. The result of four days’ hunting last week, the game averaged 200 pounds apiece, and the unanimous opinion of all the hunters was that Dame Fortune smiled on them during
